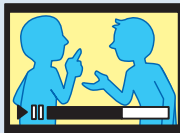
## Point 2 Specializes in daily life situations

### Video

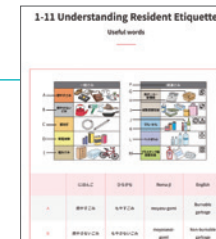
Videos that correspond with the theme are posted.
